# The Congregation at Prayer

*A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer*

*The Resurrection of Our Lord: Risen, Reliable, Hopeful*

March 28-April 3, 2016

## **The Order of Meditation and Prayer**

### ***Risen, Reliable, Hopeful***

The Lord has promised to “create new heavens and a new earth” (Is. 65:17), in which His people shall abide in peace and joy. That new creation has begun in the bodily resurrection of Christ Jesus. All the baptized belong to that new creation. Rebom of water and the Holy Spirit, they are “the offspring of the blessed of the Lord” (Is. 65:23). The Lord rejoices and is glad in them; He hears and answers their prayers. For “if in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied” (1 Cor. 15:19). But Christ Jesus has been raised, “the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep” (1 Cor. 15:20). We may be “perplexed about this” (Luke 24:4), perhaps even frightened and brought to our knees, because it seems like an “idle tale” (Luke 24:11). But faith clings to the truth, and the reliable Word of Christ tells us to find His resurrected body — not in the tomb, but in His Holy Supper.

*Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.*

***Believing is Seeing!* ~ John 20:19-31**

Do you have to see it to believe it? If it sounds too good, it must not be true. Our skepticism today is no different than those in Jesus' day. Jesus told His disciples that He would be alive again in three days, yet they could not imagine it to be true. So when the women returned and said that He IS alive, they ran to the tomb to check it out for themselves. When Thomas heard from his fellow disciples that they had seen Jesus, he would not believe until he saw Him for himself. Jesus made the reality of His resurrection evident not only to the disciples, but to hundreds of people in several appearances, so that they could be official witnesses of the resurrection. If we believe what Jesus says, we too can be witnesses to the resurrection in our testimony of faith. We may not have seen Him, yet we believe. So it will be when Jesus returns. Believing is seeing!

# St. Paul's Ballot for Nominations

This ballot is used to recommend individual(s) within the congregation for a leadership position.

The process consists of:

1. Fill out the ballot with the name of the individual you are recommending and for what position within the St Paul's organization. Individuals being recommended are expected to currently be involved in Worship, the Lord's Supper, and Bible Study.
2. Turn the ballot in by way of the offering plate or return the ballot to the church office **NO LATER THAN MAY 1.**
3. The ballots are turned into the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee will review the recommendations for the best ministry opportunity based on skills sets of the individual and the needs of the respective boards. Upon approval from the committee for a position, nominee will be contacted by a committee member to inform them that they have been chosen to be a candidate for a given office.
4. Nominees are asked to prayerfully consider the position. If they request additional information, the Nominating Committee will supply the duties of that position or that Board.
5. A follow up call is scheduled and the nominee is asked if they will accept the nomination.
6. If the nominee accepts the nomination their name is placed on the preliminary slate of candidates. This preliminary slate of candidates is presented in writing to the congregation (3) weeks before the upcoming Voters' Meeting. Additional names can be added up to (2) weeks prior the Voters' Meeting so that due diligence can be accomplished.
7. The final slate of nominees will be printed (1) week prior the Voters' Meeting.

No nominations will be accepted from the floor during the Voter's Meeting.

## "Living as a Minority"

In modern America, Biblically faithful Christians and congregations are being viewed skeptically, marginalized, or even considered enemies of the state. Being a Biblically faithful Christian is increasingly a "minority position." How do we live faithfully in this environment? The book of *Acts* has a lot to say to us in this regard, for it records the beginning of the Church in the midst of the Roman Empire.

All early Christians left a "cultural majority" (whether Judaism or some form of paganism) because they were convinced that "Jesus is Lord." (Philippians 2:11) As Christians, they and their congregations had to learn to live faithfully as a minority in the midst of a sometimes hostile majority. That was their reality. From May 8 through November 20, 2016, St. Paul's will explore the book of *Acts* under the theme, "Living as a Minority," with a strong emphasis on applying the Christian faith to life in our culture.

Each week during this extended series we will have:

1. Sermon
2. Small Group Bible Study
3. Daily Devotion

# THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

## Isaiah 65:17–25 (ESV)

*Pew Bible pg. 793*

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress. No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the young man shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed. They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be the offspring of the blessed of the LORD, and their descendants with them. Before they call I will answer; while they are yet speaking I will hear. The wolf and the lamb shall graze together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, and dust shall be the serpent's food.
