A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer
The Seventh Sunday after Epiphany: *Holy in Christ*
February 19-26, 2017

Holy in Christ

God reveals His perfect holiness in compassion as “he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust” (Matt. 5:45). By His grace in Jesus Christ, we are holy, just as He is holy (Lev. 19:2), and we are “God’s temple” in whom “God’s Spirit dwells” (1 Cor. 3:16). This gift of holiness begins with fearing, loving and trusting God above all things, and it leads us to love our neighbor as ourselves (Lev. 19:18). Therefore, no longer should we practice “injustice in court.” No longer should we “be partial to the poor or defer to the great.” No longer should we “go around as a slanderer” among God’s people. No longer should we “take vengeance or bear a grudge” (Lev. 19:15–18). Though we were His enemies, our Lord Jesus Christ has loved us and forgiven us. Nourished and sustained by His holy body and blood, we “shall be holy” (Lev. 19:2) even as the Lord our God is holy.

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Looking forward to the Transfiguration of Our Lord

February 18/19, 2017

That Changes Everything! (Pastor O'Donnell)

In the Transfiguration Jesus revealed His divine nature: "He was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun" (Matt. 17:2). Thus, Moses and Elijah, Peter, James, and John witnessed the fulfillment of the Old Testament in the Lord Jesus, a fulfillment to which the Father testified in echo of the promise to Moses (Deut 18.15) and Jesus' own Baptism: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 17:5). Indeed, the Transfiguration points to the Resurrection of Jesus, which "more fully confirms the prophetic word." Therefore, we "do well to pay attention" to the Word "as to a lamp shining in a dark place." (2 Peter 1:19). That is, through faith our minds are transformed, for we understand that the divine glory of Jesus is manifested in the Word of His apostles, who were "eyewitnesses of his majesty" (2 Peter 1:16). Therefore, "the appearance of the glory of the Lord" is no longer "like a devouring fire" (Ex. 24:17). In fact, through faith we understand that as "Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel" went up the mountain with Moses and "beheld God, and ate and drank" (Ex. 24:9, 11), we also behold the Lord our God in Christ Jesus as we eat and drink His body and blood at the altar.

LIFE THOUGHTS IN THE CHURCH YEAR

God has designated every human person to be a holy dwelling for His Spirit (Leviticus 19:2; 1 Corinthians 3:16-17). He makes each His own not by punishment or putting us to death – though we deserve it – but by loving us as He loves Himself (Leviticus 19:18). Sheltering our neighbors with the same respect and protection, whether we regard them worthy or unworthy, reflects the Creator’s perfected purpose. *Maker and Giver of all good, let Your love overflow in our service to each other. Amen.*

Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-18 ~ ESV

And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them, You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap your field right up to its edge, neither shall you gather the gleanings after your harvest. And you shall not strip your vineyard bare, neither shall you gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard. You shall leave them for the poor and for the sojourner: I am the Lord your God. You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against the sons of your own people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord."

According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it. Let each one take care how he builds upon it. Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. If the work that anyone has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple. Let no one deceive himself. If anyone among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness," and again, "The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile." So let no one boast in men. For all things are yours, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours, and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's.

But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well.
