

In Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, "the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law" (Rom. 3:21). That is, this Jesus "God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith" (Rom. 3:25), for GOD is "just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" (Rom. 3:26). This eternal Good News (Gospel) is to be proclaimed "to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people" (Rev. 14:6); that is, to you, for by the hearing of this Gospel "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free," (John 8:31-32) freed from slavery to sin and death, freed to be live generously.

Third Grade is a Thrilling Place to Be!

Third grade is a special year where children become more independent and begin to see themselves as unique individuals. We began our school year figuring out where we are located in the world – address, city, state, country, continent, and finally planet. As one child commented, “The world looks like a small place, but when you study it, you see how big it really is!” Students begin to sense that their lives here in Oconomowoc are just a small part of the world at large. They begin to understand more about the greatness of God as they look at the world He created.



To celebrate the changing seasons of summer to fall, we are making fall wreaths with the scripture, “Oh give thanks unto the Lord for he is good, and his love endures forever.” Psalm 107:1. Though we see the seasons changing, scripture reminds us that we have a God who does not change. What great comfort that brings us all.

As we prepare to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation we are busy memorizing and practicing our songs for the special church service on October 29. The third grade class spends the year studying *My First Catechism* (a first catechism version for younger children), and we will also spend time studying Martin Luther and the history of the Reformation. Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed: "I will go before you and level the exalted places, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, I will give you the treasures of darkness and the hoards in secret places, that you may know that it is I, the Lord, the God of Israel, who call you by your name. For the sake of my servant Jacob, and Israel my chosen, I call you by your name, I name you, though you do not know me. I am the Lord, and there is no other, besides me there is no God; I equip you, though you do not know me, that people may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is none besides me; I am the Lord, and there is no other. Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you, because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything. For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come .

Then the Pharisees went and plotted how to entangle [Jesus] in his talk. And they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard it, they marveled. And they left him and went away.
