

The Congregation at Prayer

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer
The Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost: *Looking to Jesus*August 25-September 1, 2019

Looking to Jesus

As we begin the 2019-2020 school year we rejoice, for by the cross of Christ, He is gathering "all nations and tongues" (Is. 66:18). Many "will come from east and west, and from northand south, and recline at the table in the kingdom of God" (Luke 13:29), but only by the narrow way of the cross, which Christ experienced "for the joy set before him" (Heb 12.2). Those who refuse to follow Christ crucified will ultimately find only "weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Luke 13:28), whereas Christ's disciples—those "looking to Jesus" (Heb 12.2)—from all the nations, will know the glory of heaven, eating and drinking and worshipping with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and all the heavenly host.

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Invocation

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Christ-Centered Theme: Jesus Christ is God's forgiving embrace of the creation; "looking to Jesus" is to embrace the fullness of God's glory.



Heavenly Greatness (Rethinking the Christian Wedding)

"Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled," Jesus proclaims, but "he who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 14:11). Indeed, Jesus is the example of this, for, "though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant. . . " (Philippians 2:6–7, ESV) Christ's life of service is utterly transformative for us. He took the lowest possible place—death in our place—that we may be exalted. "It is the glory of God to conceal things. . . " (Proverbs 25:2, ESV) Thus, only by faith can we see heavenly greatness of Christ, the greatness that shows itself in humility and says, "Friend, move up higher," (Luke 14:10, 13–14) the greatness that delights in exalting the low and "shows hospitality to strangers" (Heb. 13:2). How might this heavenly understanding of greatness change your family dinner... or the Christian wedding?

READINGS FOR THE ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Isaiah 66:18-23

"For I know their works and their thoughts, and the time is coming to gather all nations and tongues. And they shall come and shall see my glory, and I will set a sign a mong them. And from them I will send survivors to the nations, to Tarshish, Pul, and Lud, who draw the bow, to Tubal and Javan, to the coastlands a far off, that have not heard my fame or seen my glory. And they shall declare my glory a mong the nations. And they shall bring all your brothers from all the nations as an offering to the LORD, on horses and in chariots and in litters and on mules and on dromedaries, to my holy mountain Jerusalem, says the LORD, just as the Israelites bring their grain offering in a clean vessel to the house of the LORD. And some of them also I will take for priests and for Levites, says the LORD. "For as the new heavens and the new earth that I make shall remain before me, says the LORD, so shall your offspring and your name remain. From new moon to new moon, and from Sabbath to Sabbath, all flesh shall come to wors hip before me, dedares the LORD."

Hebrews 12:1-2

The refore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Luke 13:22-30

[Jesus] went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying toward Jerus alem. And someone said to him, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" And he said to them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then he will answer you, 'I do not know where you come from.' Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.' But he will say, 'I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!' In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God but you yourselves cast out. And people will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God. And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."
