It can be challenging to take time everyday to pray and read scripture, but it is what we need to develop a solid foundation so we are ready for what the world throws at us. Christ wants us to have a strong relationship with him and this is impossible to do if we do not prioritize spending time in his presence.

I am realizing the importance of these connections the older I get. I was a stay at home mom for several years when I was in the thick of raising my kids. My whole life was based on them hitting milestones. I would think to myself when they get to A or B life will be easier. I found all too quickly it does not happen that way. Each milestone has its challenges. There were times while raising my kids that I found it more difficult to stay connected with God. Because of this, my other connections suffered. I found that I have to make God a priority. If I did not do this, my world quickly spiraled out of control.

My kids are now 26, 20, and 18. When my oldest left after Christmas to go back to Colorado it was very difficult for me. I knew my daughter would not be far behind going back to college and Nico my 18-year-old is on his way to graduating high school. Looking back now I wish I had cherished those milestones more instead of wishing for the next one. As I navigate this new phase in my life I feel the need to be more connected to Christ than ever. I do not have my kids' busyness anymore and have lost many of the connections that I made through them. My connections are now separate from my kids and are not based on my "Mom" status. I am establishing new connections in friendships, work, and marriage. Through it all, I am working diligently on staying connected to Christ through prayer and quiet time.

# Lenten Themes: Christian Parenting & Friendship

"Finally, all of you, have unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart, and a humble mind." (1 Peter 3:8, ESV)

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Whether you are a parent or grandparent, aunt or uncle, friend or neighbor, we all have an interest in parenting. Given the Christian understanding of the Church as the one body of Christ with many members (cf. 1 Cor 12.12-27); and, because Christ locates Himself in Word and Sacrament (Thus, especially, in worship.) the Church is the place where one comes to know the true, "brotherly love" of Christ (cf. 1 Pet 3.8; Heb 13.1).

Again, even if you're not a parent, you can gain understanding and learn skills to help you be a better friend and neighbor to parents; in particular, you can be a better brother or sister in Christ to another Church member or family.

Our Lenten season of repentance and preparation for the celebration of Christ's passion and resurrection begins with Ash Wednesday, 14 February 2024. (That means you'll want to do your secular "Valentine's Day" stuff on "Fat Tuesday", February 13<sup>th</sup> (1) Pastor Schockman will be preaching a Lenten mid-week series on "Friendship" wherein he'll draw especially from the Bible's book of *Proverbs*. Those services are Wednesdays midday at 12:15pm or in the evening at 6:30pm. The evening service is preceded by a Lenten Supper from 5-6:15pm. Before the evening service this year we will have a hymn-sing from 6:15-6:30 where we'll get to sing some great Lenten hymns and learn about their theology and musicology.

For the weekend Lord's Day services in Lent there will be focus on "The Christian" Parent," but—as noted above—you'll find the Word applies to all, whether you're a parent or not. On the next page is a summary of dates, titles, and texts for Lenten "The Christian Parent" Series.

Date	Festival	Key Reading	Title	Note
2/18/24	Lent 1	Mk 1.9-15	Baptism and Temptation	Temptation follows Baptism. Jesus expected it. So should we.
2/25/24	Lent 2	Mk 8.27- 38	Presenting Jesus	Witness to Jesus takes children beyond "cartoon kindness" to see that He is the Savior who is both suffering servant and exalted Lord.
3/3/24	Lent 3	Jn 2.13	Law and Gospel	No getting around it: Jesus is the Glory of God. His Word convicts us of sin, and it also forgives and heals. It's a both/and.
3/10/24	Lent 4	Jn 3.14- 21	Cultivating Virtue	Christians rejoice in the gift of salvation and the good that God does in their midst.

Please join us for *both* the Lord's Day services of the weekend *and* the mid-week meals and service. These are great opportunities to learn, grow, and have fellowship that we all need.

On the above note, a number of people have asked me how the presentation of my paper about Christian friendship went. Short answer: it was very well received. Given the above encouragement about mid-week services, I quote a portion of my paper:

There is a robust relationship between frequency of worship and feelings of loneliness . . . Fewer than one in four (23 percent) of Americans who attend religious services multiple times a week report they are lonely at least once in a while. (Daniel Cox, et. al. "A Loneliness Epidemic?" American Enterprise Inst. 2019)

All of this means that if, for example, you participate in the weekly Divine Service, help with some aspect of the church's life of mercy, and attend the mid-week Lenten services, you are *significantly* more likely than those who do not, to be healthy in body and soul.

Participation in the life of the Church has scientifically and theologically demonstrable benefits. If you're reading this and have been irregular in worship or quite outside the Christian life, Lent is a great opportunity to come back or begin. You can also make an appointment with Pastor Schockman or myself. We'd love to hear from you and do our part to help integrate you into the life of Christ at St. Paul's.


Commemoration of St. Timothy, Pastor and Confessor

#### Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but *help and support him in every physical need*" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.
