An Opportunity Regarding Friendship

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Man, is this an interesting time! This year's church and school theme, *Connected in Christ*, with the focus on friendship, has driven me into the Scriptures and to research on friendship. I was so taken by some of the discoveries, so fascinating and eager to dive deeper, that I submitted a proposed abstract for a conference paper. I was surprised, delighted—and a little terrified!—to have the proposal accepted. At the 39th Annual Symposium on Exegetical Theology in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, I will be presenting, "Rediscovering 'Philadelphia': The Friendship of Jesus in John 15 and 21, and Its Importance for 21st Century Mission and Pastoral Formation." Here's the abstract and thesis:

American culture is experiencing what some public intellectuals call a "friendship recession," and what the U.S. Surgeon General calls "a loneliness epidemic." This epidemic has dramatic consequences for body and soul. For the body, "loneliness and social isolation increase the risk for premature death by 26 and 29% respectively." Shockingly, "lacking social connection is as dangerous [for the body] as smoking up to 15 cigarettes a day." For the soul, isolation from the friendship of Jesus is even more dramatic. It means a life lived in opposition to God and an eternity at enmity with him.

Fortunately, the loneliness epidemic is a health crisis for which the Church of Jesus Christ has the only true cure. As John Kleinig notes, "Christian friendship is the most profound form of friendship because it is eternal." This paper will briefly examine Jesus's definition of friendship in John 15, contrast it with Aristotle's definition from his Nichomachean Ethics, and explore the importance of Christian friendship through reflection on Jesus's restoration of Peter in John 21.

Thesis: The Church's robust cultivation of "the brotherly love of Jesus" is vital for twenty-first century congregational mission and pastoral formation.

I am particularly thankful to the faculty at St. Paul's for hearing the deep longing that I sensed in this topic and agreeing wholeheartedly to make it our theme. I am also very thankful for the responses of people on many levels to the importance of this subject. I am eager to share my continuing research with you and—so help us, God—share in the blessings that come from more deeply understanding—and practicing—the friendship of Jesus.
