A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer The Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost: *Stand with UNSHAKEABLE JOY in CHRIST* September 1 - 8, 2024

Stand with UNSHAKEABLE JOY in CHRIST

Wickedness and evil come *"from within, out of the heart,"* and that is what defiles a person (Mark 7:21–23). Hence, we cannot save ourselves, because we are sinful and unclean from the inside out. But as the Lord Jesus *"declared all foods clean"* (Mark 7:19), so He cleanses us by His Word, the preaching of repentance and the forgiveness of sins. For His Word is righteous, and to live according to it is *"your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples"* (Deut. 4:6). Cling to His Word, and also teach it *"to your children and your children's children"* (Deut. 4:9). Put on this *"armor of God"* by hearing what He speaks to you, that you may *"stand firm"* in the evil day (Eph. 6:11–13). What Paul lays out for us in verses 14-16 are the gifts that God has given us by His Spirit in Christ. Truth. Righteousness. The gospel of peace. Faith. Salvation. And finally, the WORD OF GOD which calls us to pray for all the saints. Also, for those who speak the Gospel, that the good news of the unshakeable joy in Christ would be rightly shared.

Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Anxious Hearts Find Comfort in Him Who Does All Things Well (Pastor Schockman) The Lord proclaims the Gospel "to those who have an anxious heart" to comfort and encourage them with His presence. He opens "the eyes of the blind" and "the ears of the deaf," and He loosens "the tongue of the mute" to "sing for joy" (Is. 35:5–6). Like water on thirsty ground, He speaks His life-giving Word and does "all things well," so that you may now speak "plainly" (Mark 7:31–37). In Christ, you can confess the truth of God to the glory of His holy name. Call upon His name in every trouble, confident that He will hear and answer. As you pray and confess with your tongue, so also "love your neighbor as yourself" (James 2:8). Show your faith "in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory," by loving without partiality. For God has "chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom" (James 2:1–5).


You're Invited! Parent Partnership Workshops

Open to St. Paul's and public-school parents, and all who are interested

St. Paul's '24-'25 Church and school theme explores many facets of grit and endurance under the theme, "Unshakeable Joy in Christ." The theme verse is

Roman 5.2b: ". . . We rejoice in hope of the glory of God," and our theme hymn is "A Mighty Fortress is Our God."

As part of the exploration under this theme, many St. Paul's leaders will be reading Carl Trueman's *Strange New Word: How Thinkers and Activists Redefined Identity and Sparked the Sexual Revolution*. Want to better understand why your children and young people think the way they do? Want to live more faithfully, sympathetically, and hopefully in Christ?



Trueman's book help us understand why we moderns think as we do, but Trueman is not a bombastic, conservative jerk. His work represents a sympathetic reading of the source material and a faithful pastoral perspective that helps Christians live faithfully and hopefully.

Given the value that this study represents, Pastor O'Donnell is offering an opportunity for parents and others to a series of *Parent Partnership Workshops* that will occur on many Sundays when the middle school youth group meets. This will give parents the opportunity to join the study while the youth group is meeting. The **first class is Sunday, September 29**th

at 5:30pm in the Fellowship Hall (ground floor, below the sanctuary).

The Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Old Testament: Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

"Now, O Israel, listen to the statutes and the just decrees that I am teaching you, and do them, that you may live, and go in and take possession of the land that the Lord, the God of your fathers, is giving you. You shall not add to the word that I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the Lord your God that I command you. . . .

Keep them and do them, for that will be your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples, who, when they hear all these statutes, will say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.' For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the Lord our God is to us, whenever we call upon him? And what great nation is there, that has statutes and just decrees so righteous as all this law that I set before you today?

"Only take care, and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. Make them known to your children and your children's children."

Epistle: Ephesians 6:10-20

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

Holy Gospel: Mark 7:14-23

[Jesus] called the people to him again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand: There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." And when he had entered the house and left the people, his disciples asked him about the parable. And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him.
