The Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost

Old Testament Reading: Ecclesiastes 5:10–20

He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves wealth with his income; this also is vanity. When goods increase, they increase who eat them, and what advantage has their owner but to see them with his eyes? Sweet is the sleep of a laborer, whether he eats little or much, but the full stomach of the rich will not let him sleep.

There is a grievous evil that I have seen under the sun: riches were kept by their owner to his hurt, and those riches were lost in a bad venture. And he is father of a son, but he has nothing in his hand. As he came from his mother's womb he shall go again, naked as he came, and shall take nothing for his toil that he may carry away in his hand. This also is a grievous evil: just as he came, so shall he go, and what gain is there to him who toils for the wind? Moreover, all his days he eats in darkness in much vexation and sickness and anger.

Behold, what I have seen to be good and fitting is to eat and drink and find enjoyment in all the toil with which one toils under the sun the few days of his life that God has given him, for this is his lot. Everyone also to whom God has given wealth and possessions and power to enjoy them, and to accept his lot and rejoice in his toil—this is the gift of God. For he will not much remember the days of his life because God keeps him occupied with joy in his heart.

Epistle: Hebrews 4:1–13

Therefore, while the promise of entering his rest still stands, let us fear lest any of you should seem to have failed to reach it. For good news came to us just as to them, but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened. For we who have believed enter that rest, as he has said,

"As I swore in my wrath,

'They shall not enter my rest,"

although his works were finished from the foundation of the world. For he has somewhere spoken of the seventh day in this way: "And God rested on the seventh day from all his works." And again in this passage he said, "They shall not enter my rest."

Since therefore it remains for some to enter it, and those

who formerly received the good news failed to enter because of disobedience, again he appoints a certain day, "Today," saying through David so long afterward, in the words already quoted,

"Today, if you hear his voice,

do not harden your hearts."

For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken of another day later on. So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his.

Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience. For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

Holy Gospel: Mark 10:23-31

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How difficult it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were amazed at his words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." And they were exceedingly astonished, and said to him, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God." Peter began to say to him, "See, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you," there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first."

Unshakeable Joy-and Restin Christ

The 22nd Sunday after Pentecost (Pr 24) 20 October, A.D. 2024 Eccl 5.10-20; Heb 4.1-13; Mk 10.23-31

In Ecclesiastes 5, The LORD tells us, "*He who loves money will not be satisfied with money . . . "*(Ecclesiastes 5:10a, ESV) Now, take that sentence, cross out "money," and put blank lines in those two places: "*He who loves _____ will not be satisfied with _____. . . "*

Now, I want you to do the hard part. I want you to really think about this. Children and adults, think about it: What do you love *most of all*? Put *that*—what *that* is—on those two lines.

Now, I want to ask you an even harder question: What would you do if *that* was taken away? Consider how Solomon puts it in Ecclesiastes 5.15: "*As he came from his mother's womb he shall go again, naked as he came, and shall take nothing for his toil that he may carry away in his hand.*" (Ecclesiastes 5:15, ESV)

Whatever you put on those lines, whatever you love most of all, that is your _____. You see,

"... the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged _____, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account." (Hebrews 4:12–13, ESV)

In Matthew 10, Jesus says, "Whoever loves father or mother more than _____is not worthy of ____, and whoever loves son or daughter more than _____is not worthy of ____." (Matthew 10:37, ESV) In our Gospel reading today, ". . . Jesus said to them again, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a _____ person to enter the kingdom of God."" (Mark 10:24–25, ESV) I suspect, that like me, and like Peter and the apostles, you might be stunned by what the ______of the Word just exposed in your life. Some of you might have just now realized a false god that you didn't know you had; for some of you, you're not going to feel the cut for a while . . . but later, after the adrenaline of your striving wears off, that cut's going to burn. Whether now or later, you too will realize your spiritual peril and ask Jesus, "Then who can be saved?" (Mk 10.26)

And Jesus' answer remains: ". . . With ______it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God."" (Mark 10:27, ESV) Only ______ can take us through the eye of that needle. Only the Lamb of God who has taken away the sin of the world, can declare us truly righteous. Only Jesus, the One who rose from the dead *in the body*, can take us through that needle and "*transform our lowly bodies to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.*" (Philippians 3:21, ESV)

That truth is a life-changer. It puts—literally—everything else in perspective: childhood, adolescence, adulthood, old age, politics, economics. Whatever five-part sermon series topic you might want. All of it. For crying out loud, the truth that "all our striving is vanity" puts recess and vacations in perspective, for "play" can be a false god. "Leisure" can be a false god. And when you recognize all this and ______... when you realize that only "the Name that is above all names" can possibly ______, well, then you can learn to truly enjoy whatever wealth or possessions or work or leisure that _____ has given you. (Eccl 5.18-20) For, only [CCT:] _____ [do] we have true joy in work, and true rest of body and soul.

May the peace of God, which passes all human understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.

Unshakeable Joy – and Rest – in Christ

"He who loves money will not be satisfied with money," (Eccl 5.10) says The LORD. Indeed, He says, "... How difficult it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!... It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God."" (Mark 10:23b, 25) Let us, therefore, repent of our endless striving after things that cannot truly satisfy, finding joy in our work (Eccl 5.18) and true rest of soul through faith in Christ, the author of work... and of rest. 
