Ladies Aid



Then we have Bible story time, and the class really likes to learn more about their favorite Bible characters. Often, we complete a project that helps us remember our Bible stories or gives an opportunity to witness about our faith.

Our language arts block (called Superkids Workshop) finds us reading and writing, sorting and spelling words, practicing our phonics skills, and learning new vocabulary words. Working in small groups or with a partner makes this a fun time of learning together. We usually have more things to do than time to do it, so that is a good place to start things the next day.

We also are learning a new math curriculum this year filled with discovery and conversations about numbers and how they work and learning strategies to help us solve problems. The lesson usually ends with hands-on activities called work places which may be a game with friends or a challenge to increase our understanding of math concepts.

We round out our day with social studies or science, and right now we are working on map skills of the continents and oceans. Visits to the science lab are always a special surprise! Then spatter in an art project or music class, choir practice or gym class, STEM activities, a few recesses, snacks, and lunch, and you have a very full—and very fun—day! Everyone may be a bit tired out, but the next day we are all full of energy to do it again! ©

What's He Looking For? (Pastor Schockman)

Those who contribute "large sums" from "out of their abundance" have done very little. They cannot purchase God's favor with their money. But the "poor widow" with her two small coins, who "out of her poverty has put in everything she had," entrusts herself, her very life to the mercy of God (Mark 12:41–44). Such faith is not disappointed, for the Lord is faithful, and He provides for His people by His grace. Thus was the poor widow of Zarephath able to feed the prophet Elijah "for many days," as well as herself and her household, "according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah" (1 Kings 17:15–16). He feeds us, too, by His Word, not only with daily bread for this body and life, but with His body and blood unto life everlasting. "By the sacrifice of himself," by the giving of His body and life and all that He had, He has entered "into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf" (Heb. 9:24–26). Faith clings to Christ who put in all He had that we may live.)

Life Thoughts in the Church Year

Almighty God has given us solemn privilege and responsibility to instruct children about their Heavenly Father (Deuteronomy 6:7). They need to know the power and presence and compassion of Christ Jesus is sufficient (Hebrews 9:14), even in surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis.

~ Revelation 14:13 (ESV)





And I heard the number of the sealed, 144,000, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel:

12,000 from the tribe of Judah were sealed,

12,000 from the tribe of Reuben,

12,000 from the tribe of Gad,

12,000 from the tribe of Asher,

12,000 from the tribe of Naphtali,

12,000 from the tribe of Manasseh,

12,000 from the tribe of Simeon,

12,000 from the tribe of Levi,

12,000 from the tribe of Issachar,

12,000 from the tribe of Zebulun,

12,000 from the tribe of Joseph,

12,000 from the tribe of Benjamin were sealed.

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, "Amen! Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.


