We are Alert, Awaiting the Coming of Christ

The signs of the end are all around us, constant reminders that "heaven and earth will pass away." But all of these signs are centered in the cross of Christ, whereby He has conquered sin and death, that we might be raised with Him in righteousness through His Word of the Gospel, which "will not pass away" (Mark 13:31). He is "the firstborn of the dead," who in His great love "has freed us from our sins by his blood" (Rev. 1:5). For this purpose He came into the world, the righteousness of Christ is "a light to the peoples," which "will never be dismayed" because it is the justice of His cross and resurrection (Is. 51:4–6). As He "is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory," so wait upon "the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life" (Jude 20–24).

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

When Love Comes to Town (Pastor O'Donnell)

Advent is about remembering that Jesus came, that He still comes to us, and that He will come again to complete the New Creation. We begin this season remembering His triumphal entry on the way to His death. As we gather for the Supper we sing "Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord!" (Lk 19.38) We remember that He came because we are un-righteous. We need what only God can give: His righteousness (see Jer 33.16) We remember His love for us, and—receiving His forgiveness—we live toward His promised return, (So help us, God!) "abounding in love for one another." (1 Thes 3.12)

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE GREEN ROOM IN THE ECC?

Hello from the E.C.C. green room, the two-year-old room! We have had a busy fall so far. This week we learned all about Autumn! We have been having so much fun learning math, science, art, fine motor activities, gross motor activities, and sensory activities that have a fall theme. They have been having so much fun learning! This week:

<u>Chapel</u>: This week we read the story of David and Goliath from 1 Samuel 17. By the end of the week they started telling me the story! This week they loved hearing how David knew that God would help him win the battle. We talked about how Goliath had a shield, but it did not protect him. The King gave David a shield, but he didn't use it. David knew that God was his best shield and protection. The battle is the Lord's!

<u>Science</u>: Leaf and pumpkin exploration. They got to use a magnifying glass to look at leaves, and some pulp and seeds from a pumpkin in a Ziplock bag for them to explore.

<u>Math</u>: They have to guess which hay bale with a shape on it has the scarecrow hiding under it. This is a fun way to help them learn their shapes.

Also, for math we are practicing sorting by organizing different fall items.

Art: Fall Q-Tip tree painting, leaf rubbings, and a fall scarecrow collage

<u>Sensory</u>: Fall touch box: I placed fall items in a box such as leaves, acorns, small pumpkins, gourds, and leaves. They guess what is inside!

<u>Fine Motor</u>: Fall button tree. They practiced their fine motor skills. They took pipe cleaners and twisted them at the bottom and spread the pipe cleaner out to make them look like the branches of a tree. The kids then take buttons and put them on the tree like leaves.

Gross motor skills: Welcome Autumn song and a leaf hunt

And then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.

"From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts out its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"But concerning that day or that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Be on guard, keep awake. For you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his servants in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to stay awake. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake."

If you are physically unable to come forward, please let an usher know and the pastor will come to you and give you communion. Those communing should mark this on the attendance card. If you have guestions, our pastors will be pleased to speak with you.

Distribution and Communion Wine

Please place open hands out to receive the Body of Christ and also to indicate whether you are receiving the Blood of Christ from the common cup or the individual cup.
