Although my family was very involved at Elm Grove Lutheran Church, I didn't attend the day school until 7th grade. However, my time at EGL, especially as a middle schooler, profoundly impacted the rest of my academic journey and vocation. It was at EGL that I first experienced what it felt like to be truly loved and cared for by a teacher.

Some of you may be familiar with my story (you can read more at christinallthings.org), but for those who aren't, I had the blessing of being a student under the guidance of Mr. Paul Gruetzmacher. At the time, I was disengaged, lacked confidence in my abilities, and didn't know how to learn. Yet, Mr. Gruetzmacher saw me as a unique child of God—someone not just capable, but able. The way he did this, with 36 students in the classroom, still amazes me. I'm grateful for him every day in my prayers.

I see those same caring qualities in the teachers at St. Paul's. Each of them has been uniquely gifted by God to care for the whole child, not just the student who needs to learn to read and write. They see each student as capable and able, and they answer God's call to teach with Unshakeable Joy in Christ. These teachers share their gifts with our students and their families everyday.

Our enrollment period for the 2025-2026 school year officially begins on Monday, February 3. Parents have many important decisions to make for their children's futures, and I believe choosing the right school is one of the most crucial.


There is extensive research showing that Lutheran schools positively impact a child's learning in profound ways. Smaller class sizes allow for greater student-to-teacher interaction; academic content consistently meets or exceeds state and national standards; students are taught to think critically, show compassion, and serve others. They develop a strong moral compass, enriched by a biblical worldview that informs every subject. Most importantly, they develop a strong identity in Christ as they encounter the Law and the Gospel every day.

If your child spends a minimum of 40 hours each week at school, wouldn't you want to know that they are in the care and company of adults and families who share your values and faith?

**Notes from Pastor's Study**

In this second month of the year we typically stop on the fourteenth day to celebrate love. I see it everywhere. Even gas stations and Walgreen's are stocked with pink and red candy, the pajama section at Old Navy is overflowing with 'love' themed pants, and heart shaped chocolate boxes are available pretty much everywhere.

In 2025, Valentine's Day spending is projected to be well over \$25 BILLION. While this may be the retail reality, I think there is more to true love that this. Remember first and foremost that "God is Love" (see 1 John 4). If you want to know what that means you don't have to look any farther than the second person of the Trinity, Jesus.

In Him, God was pleased to demonstrate His love. Romans 5:8 says: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Jesus was sent to be the sacrifice for the sin of those who hated him (that's us). That kind of love is not based on a sappy emotional response. It is a dedicated decision to do what is best for others, even when it is uncomfortable for you. That love is a choice.

Thank God that His love knows no bounds. His choice to love the unlovable is what gives us the strength to believe the unbelievable. That despite our frequent failures and sinful short-comings we are loved by God. And what is more is that love is made sure and certain in the person and work, the life death and resurrection of the second person of the Trinity, the sin-soaked sacrifice of the Son of God has made it plain. There need be no doubt that you are loved.

If you need still more encouragement, look to your Baptism and be secure. There, God placed his name on you. But more than that, he made you a part of the death and resurrection of Christ (see Romans 6). You could say He poured His love out on you. Much like the water and Word were poured out on the day you were made part of the kingdom.

In Christ, God paid the ultimate price to show you His love. He continues to richly and daily provide all the love that you could need in His Son. In Christ, God continues to give His love to us in His body and blood that enlivens our hearts to share what is truly love with those around us—that is Jesus, and His cross-shaped Love for you.


