The Fifth Sunday after Epiphany: Worthy in Christ
February 9 – 16, 2025

#### Worthy in Christ

Peter is right. He is "a sinful man," (Lk 5.8) and so are we. As Isaiah says, we are "men of unclean lips, dwelling in the midst of people of unclean lips." (Isa 6.5) As Peter and Isaiah confess, in our natural rebellion, we cannot be in God's presence, but as The Lord taught Peter and Isaiah, he also teaches each of us that we are worthy in Christ. Those of "mature thinking" (1 Cor 14.20) live from this promise of God, not from infantile assumptions based on worldly wisdom. Jesus Christ declares you worthy, and it is so.

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

#### The Two Trusts (Pastor O'Donnell)

"Cursed is the man who trusts in man," (Jer 17.5) The LORD tells us, yet we're always fumbling about looking for earthly saviors. Instead, The LORD promises that "blessed is the man who trusts in The LORD." (Jer 17.5,7) That is, blessed is the man who knows what is of first importance; namely, that Christ died, was buried, was raised on the third day, and appeared to many. (1 Cor 15.3-5) Indeed, Christ has been raised from the dead! (1 Cor 15.20) He lays out the consequences clearly for all: "Blessed are the poor in spirit (those who repent and trust in Him), for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven," (Lk 6.20) but "woe to those who are rich (those who trust in themselves, and in man)." (Lk 6.24)



#### Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"
And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."

#### **Epistle: 1 Corinthians 14:12b-20**

Since you are eager for manifestations of the Spirit, strive to excel in building up the church.

Therefore, one who speaks in a tongue should pray for the power to interpret. For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful. What am I to do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will pray with my mind also; I will sing praise with my spirit, but I will sing with my mind also. Otherwise, if you give thanks with your spirit, how can anyone in the position of an outsider say "Amen" to your thanksgiving when he does not know what you are saying? For you may be giving thanks well enough,

but the other person is not being built up. I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. Nevertheless, in church I would rather speak five words with my mind in order to instruct others, than ten thousand words in a tongue.

Brothers, do not be children in your thinking. Be infants in evil, but in your thinking be mature.

#### Holy Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on [Jesus] to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.


