As we enter the enrollment season for the 2025-2026 school year, I have been sharing my experiences and love of St. Paul's School with ECC families that are exploring continuing their learning journey at St. Paul's or the prospect of continuing elsewhere. For some, it is a struggle determining where their child will thrive that meets the needs for their family.

I grew up in public school and was not sure what path I would choose for

my own children. I did well in school and overall enjoyed my experience. It was not until I started attending before school meetings and devotions with the St. Paul's teaching staff that my eyes were truly opened to the difference that education at St. Paul's entails. It is now abundantly solidified with my own experiences with my two children now in Third grade and Kindergarten.

If you get the chance to attend a school chapel service, you will witness what they call "raise the praise"—a time where students and staff take turns praising others for accomplishments big or small that stood out to them that week. What a way to lift each other up.

What really stands out to me from my education and that of which St. Paul's offers is growing the whole self—mind, body, spirit. The love and support here is immeasurable. Learning to walk in God's love, building friendship and confidence. In the ECC, our 2½ year old students often ask their teacher to visit "God's house". What an amazing thirst they have for the knowledge and love of God! There are numerous relationships built across the ages where the littles get to learn from the bigs and the bigs learn from the littles. In the ECC alone, we have 7th grade reading buddies, weekly pastor-led chapel and middle school music mentors.

I am beyond grateful that God led my family to St. Paul's over 20 years ago, when we first joined the church family. This journey has led me to serve the past 13 years in the ECC, where I've experienced the magic of the St. Paul's community. Now, watching my own children grow, moving from the Infant Room to grade school and eventually middle school, fills my heart with joy. I pray that others have the opportunity to feel the same love and support that has been so deeply woven into our lives here.

It's Good to be Home

"And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time." (Luke 4:13, ESV)

Dear Friends,

Jesus went through a time of solitude and temptation after His Baptism, "returned in the power of the Spirit" to conduct His public ministry, and—all the while—the devil was awaiting "the opportune time." (Lk 4.13, 14)

During my time of spiritual respite in January, and since my return on February 1st, people have asked, "What can we do to support our pastors?" That's a good question, but there is another question that is usually asked more obliquely because it makes people uncomfortable: "What can we do, and what can the pastors do, so that they avoid burnout-type situations?"

Briefly here I will attempt to answer both questions. There are, perhaps, two essential ways to support your pastors and other church workers. One, be an active member of the congregation (Pray for your pastors and fellow members, come to the Divine Service weekly and receive the gifts of God, be an active participant in a congregationally-sponsored Bible study, get involved in the congregation to share the load, give a first fruits offering to support the church's workers, facility, and mission). Secondly, and this is deeply influenced by my month of spiritual solitude and respite: support—and expect—your called church workers to have times of spiritual solitude, expect them to take vacation with their families, provide occasional times of extended respite, and give them an opportunity every seven years for a sabbatical; that is, an extended time to do whatever makes their heart sing.

The above relates directly to the second question, "What can we do to help our church workers avoid burnout?" My direct answer is that *even in the supportive situation described above, no Christian—especially a pastor—can avoid the cross.* No pastor can avoid suffering for the sake of his call to follow Christ. Any of us who attempt to faithfully uphold God's Word in our homes and in our congregations will face temptation, exclusion, opposition, slander, etc. Jesus is clear about that. All of that is hard. Thus, we need seasons of prayerful reflection and the support of others.

We enter Lent with Jesus on March 5th. I encourage you to take the journey: pray, fast, worship, serve, hope. And, thanks again for the time of respite. I needed it. And it's good to be home.

Repentance starts with being honest before God and with ourselves about who we are. When it comes to sin, everyone has a natural impulse to hide, but repentance means finding the courage to be honest. It also means having faith in the promise of forgiveness. But being honest about faith means recognizing that faith is contested not only by society, but by our own experiences, and sometimes seemingly by the actions of God himself.

Repentance means becoming more human, not less. Because our thoughts, desires, and actions are so linked with sin, it is easy to view repentance as fighting against our humanity as if holiness meant trying to stifle as many of our natural human impulses as possible. But, honest repentance recognizes that sin is the thing that stifles our humanity. Honest repentance results in our natural impulses functioning more as God designed them.

In order to explore these themes, our Midweek readings are from texts assigned for the Easter Vigil. These readings capture the broad sweep of God's saving acts culminating in baptism and the Christian use of baptism through "daily contrition and repentance," as the Small Catechism puts it. Please join us this Lenten Season as we explore **Honest Repentance**.
