The Practice and Benefits of Christian Meditation

The following is a story—fiction—to help illustrate how anyone of any age can learn Christian meditation, and how beneficial it can be.

Peter Diener was almost 17 years old, a rising senior working his second full-time summer job. His Dad, Robert, was an electrician and had his eye on Peter to join him in the trades to begin *Diener and Sons*, the family business about which he had dreamed since Peter's younger brother was born. The Dieners were pretty regular in worship. They were not regulars in Bible class, but had gone to a recent presentation by the pastor where he talked about his own personal switch from a time of daily devotions (based on reading of the Scriptures and written prayers) to a time of daily memorization of the Scriptures, meditating on them, and then writing out his prayers. Peter was intrigued by another idea the pastor presented of memorizing the Scriptures and praying while he made something with his hands. He also remembered one of the congregation members asking, "I can't take a month off. How do I get some rest of soul?" Peter recalled the pastor's response, "Everyone can arrange their schedule to have time to meditate on the Scriptures."

Peter's Dad had set him up with a summer job learning carpentry from a friend. Robert Diener wanted his son to experience how another trusted man did business, so that Peter had a wider frame of reference for the future. Peter liked his boss, but he struggled with his coworkers, most of whom were a good bit older, had a lot more life experience, and tended to be of the work-hard, play-hard crowd. The Dieners didn't do much cursing in their home, especially of sexual variety, but the guys Peter worked with were f-this and f-that all the time. Peter found himself thinking, Bruh, find another word.

On Monday, July seventh, they were sent to a big new house in Ixonia for finish carpentry. His company's best carpenter was a Greek guy named Peritt. He was a magician with wood, but utterly predictable in language, and—at twenty-four—Peritt had had a number of recent escapades with a thirty-five year-old divorcee named Narren that he met at Hogg Alley on Upper Nemahbin Lake. Peritt, as usual, in addition to the educating Peter about the fine points of finish carpentry, also felt it necessary to educate his teenage mentee about the lesser points of personal pleasure. As Peter found out, Narren's two little kids had spent the fourth of July with their Dad, so Peritt and his cougar had a long weekend of debauchery.

Fortunately, for the last three weeks Peter had been pretty serious about going to bed earlier and getting up early to give memorizing the Scriptures and morning meditation a try. Since the pastor had been working on the Sermon on the Mount, Peter thought that he would try that, too, but he had decided to do the end of the sermon, Matthew 7, as his starting point. Since he had spent the July fourth weekend up north with his family and not done any meditation, he got up early that morning and reviewed the beginning of Matthew 7, saying it out loud to keep it in memory:

"Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye." (Matthew 7:1–5, ESV)

The Epistle 2025 Page 2 So, when Peritt launched into a series of f-this and f-that stories about he and Narren's long, drunken weekend, Peter found himself both intrigued—Peritt sure could embellish a story!—and a little ashamed, not only for Peritt, who was clearly just using this woman, but also for himself, for Peter's girlfriend, Amanda, had come up north with his family. After one particularly raunchy story, Peter found himself thinking, *You're disgusting. This woman is obviously interested in you, and she's hurting from the divorce and missing her kids, and you're just lying to her. You're just using her.* Then, in his spirit, Peter cursed Peritt. As if on cue, the verse came into his mind, "Judge not, for with the judgment you use you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you." And so, even as Peritt was carrying on about his perversions, Peter was only partly listening. He was thinking about his own weekend, where he and Amanda had gone out on the boat together and gone a bit too far...

At lunch time Peter and Peritt were having a sandwich. Peritt shared some venison jerky with Peter, which was really good. Since he had spent a lot of the morning in meditating on his regret from the weekend, and thus not feeling particularly judgmental toward Peritt, Peter asked an obviously innocent question, "Is this just a pleasure thing for you two, or are you interested in each other?"

"You mean, for a 'relationship'? Not really."

"You or her?"

"Me, for sure. I'm just in it for the fun. She might be interested."

"When do you know you've taken it too far with stuff like that?"

Peritt responded with bravado, "This woman wants me. It's never too far!"

Again, Peter's tone was innocent, not condemning. He was full of self-condemnation at the moment. "Seriously, you can take that too far, right?"

Peritt cursed. The conversation had a taken a more serious turn. Suddenly, he was really thinking about why he was doing what he was doing, and realizing he actually didn't want this talented seventeen-year-old boy he was working with to repeat his mistakes. "You actually interested in Amanda?"

"Yeah, and I'm feeling pretty guilty about this last weekend."

"Ooh! Got a story to tell?" Peritt probed, but then he thought better of pursuing it.

"Seriously," Peter asked. "When is it too far?"

Peritt cursed again, and said, "It's already too far. D--- you, teenager!"

"I'm not judging you, Peritt. I'm feeling pretty guilty, myself."

"Well, I wasn't feeling guilty, but now I am."

Suddenly, a door was opened in Peritt's soul. The f-this and f-that continued, but over the next twenty minutes Peritt told the story of how his fiancé had cheated on him the previous year and since then he had been seducing one woman after another. . . and then dropping them like a dirty rag when they began to get interested. In the process, Peter realized that Peritt didn't really hate women, but that he was very, very hurt by what had happened, and that he was taking it out on others. Peter sensed that Peritt realized this, too.

The next day, Tuesday, July eighth, Peter was up at 5:00 a.m. He started the next section in Matthew 7, "Ask, and it will be given to you . . . " and as he was memorizing, a prayer came to mind: "Lord, forgive Peritt for using Narren. Heal him with Your forgiveness. Forgive me for taking things too far with Amanda last weekend. You know how a like her. Help me to respect her."

And so, Pete Diener, a teenage construction worker, began to learn Christian meditation, and how memorizing God's word can transform even a summer job into a vocation.
