Help with the Stamp Out Hunger postal workers food drive Sat., May 10th & Mon., May 12th

Oconomowoc Food Pantry (OFP) has asked for help in collecting the food from the donations at people's mailboxes on Saturday, May 10th. For a few years, the OFP has shared their abundance from this event with us, Lord's Cupboard (LC) and last year it was over 4,650lbs! We will be receiving some of this food collected this year and we need volunteers to help with the pick-up and the sorting at St. Paul's. These are the few areas that we need volunteers for on Saturday, May 10th:

- Meet at the Oconomowoc Post Office on 38 S. Main Street at 9am. You will follow/drive behind the postal workers who have a walking route and pick up the food that is donated and left at the mailboxes, then deliver that food to the OFP facility on Brown Street. We need 2+ people per route (one to drive, one or two to pick up). A SUV or a pickup truck is preferable. Time commitment is approximately 9am-12noon. We need approximately 8 groups for the different routes.
- We will need to have a few trucks and cars with trailers to pick up the food from First Congregational (815 S. Concord Road, Oconomowoc) starting at 4:00/4:30pm that LC will be given and deliver it to St. Paul's. Also, we will need people at St. Paul's to help unload the food (1-2 hours' time commitment). We can take an hour break for sorting the food at St. Paul's to go to our 5pm church service.
- Monday, May 12th, we will need a few people to go to the post office to pick up the late donations of food. Then take it to St. Paul's to unload it. Time to start that will be determined. We will also need people at St. Paul's to unload the food.

May 4 – 11, 2025

Fed by Jesus

“Worthy is the Lamb who was slain” (Rev. 5:12), who by His cross has conquered sin and death. With His blood, He has *“ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation”* (Rev. 5:9). This same Lord Jesus visits people of all nations and calls them to Himself by the Gospel, even as He *“was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead”* (John 21:14). He *“has turned our mourning into dancing and clothed us in gladness”* (Psalm 30:11) by this resurrection. This is the faith we hear confessed by our confirmands this morning as they receive the Rite of Confirmation.

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Good Shepherd Cares for His Sheep (Pastor Jason Schockman)

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came from the Father and became flesh among us in order to rescue us, His sheep. He laid down His life for us and took it up again in order to give us eternal life. By the preaching of His Gospel, He calls His sheep to Himself and keeps them with Him forever. As they hear His voice and follow Him, *“they will never perish”* (John 10:28), for *“no one is able to snatch them out of the Father’s hand”* (John 10:29). In the same way, faithful pastors (literally, “shepherds”) in Law and Gospel lead beside still waters of hope and proclaim the rod and staff of God that comfort. For we know His word of promise that even in the midst of the valley of the shadow of death, the Lord is with us (Psalm 23). Therefore, with all the company of heaven, the Good Shepherd gathers His flock in worship, as they cry: *“Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!”* (Rev. 7:10).

Old Testament: Psalm 30

I will extol you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up
and have not let my foes rejoice over me.
O Lord my God, I cried to you for help,
and you have healed me.
O Lord, you have brought up my soul from Sheol;
you restored me to life from among those who go down to the pit.
Sing praises to the Lord, O you his saints,
and give thanks to his holy name.
For his anger is but for a moment,
and his favor is for a lifetime.
Weeping may tarry for the night,
but joy comes with the morning.
As for me, I said in my prosperity,
"I shall never be moved."
By your favor, O Lord,
you made my mountain stand strong;
you hid your face;
I was dismayed.
To you, O Lord, I cry,
and to the Lord I plead for mercy:
"What profit is there in my death,
if I go down to the pit?
Will the dust praise you?
Will it tell of your faithfulness?
Hear, O Lord, and be merciful to me!
O Lord, be my helper!"
You have turned for me my mourning into dancing;
you have loosed my sackcloth
and clothed me with gladness,
that my glory may sing your praise and not be silent.
O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you forever!

Epistle: Revelation 5:6–14

And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. And he went and took the scroll from the right hand of him who was seated on the throne. And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals,

for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God

from every tribe and language and people and nation, and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth."
Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!" And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying, "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!" And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" and the elders fell down and worshiped.

Holy Gospel: John 21:1–14

After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish.
