August 17-24, 2025

Lead Me to Christ, the Rock

In their wandering toward the promised land, the people of Israel were thirsty, lost faith, and quarreled with Moses and with The LORD, who showed them his mighty and creative power by sending water from a rock (Num 20.1-13). As with all things in the Old Testament, this pointed to something to come. Centuries later, David penned Psalm 61, by which he and Israel were reminded who their rock really was. St. Paul knew it, too (1 Cor 10.1-4), as did the "little stone" among the Apostles, who made the good confession that Jesus is ". . . the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Mt 16.16) Since Jesus is risen from the dead, the author of salvation, the living water and cornerstone of faith, the Church's mission is to lead people to Christ, the Rock.

Order Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.


Lord's Cupboard food pantry date changes

Looking forward to St. Bartholomew, Apostle Hymns: 655, 583 (628, 688, 857) 644

St. Bartholomew, Apostle (Pastor Schockman)

Skinned alive! That, according to tradition, is how Bartholomew (called Nathanael in John) was martyred. Christ's preachers are not to be great lords, but servants who faithfully stay with Christ in His trials (Luke 22:24–30). They are "jars of clay"; the Savior they preach is the "surpassing power" (2 Cor. 4:7). Christ's servants are "afflicted in every way," "always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested" there (2 Cor. 4:8–10). We bear sufferings not leaning "on [our] own understanding," but trusting in the Lord (Prov. 3:5–7). Life will be manifested in our bodies, too, when the Lord brings "healing to [our] flesh and refreshment to [our] bones" in the resurrection (Prov. 3:8). For this reason, Bartholomew is often depicted holding his flayed skin. He will have need of it on the Last Day — at least for sizing.



Old Testament Reading: Numbers 20:1–13

And the people of Israel, the whole congregation, came into the wilderness of Zin in the first month, and the people stayed in Kadesh. And Miriam died there and was buried there.

Now there was no water for the congregation. And they assembled themselves together against Moses and against Aaron. And the people guarreled with Moses and said, "Would that we had perished when our brothers perished before the Lord! Why have you brought the assembly of the Lord into this wilderness, that we should die here, both we and our cattle? And why have you made us come up out of Egypt to bring us to this evil place? It is no place for grain or figs or vines or pomegranates, and there is no water to drink." Then Moses and Aaron went from the presence of the assembly to the entrance of the tent of meeting and fell on their faces. And the glory of the Lord appeared to them, and the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Take the staff, and assemble the congregation, you and Aaron your brother, and tell the rock before their eyes to yield its water. So you shall bring water out of the rock for them and give drink to the congregation and their cattle." And Moses took the staff from before the Lord, as he commanded him.

Then Moses and Aaron gathered the assembly together before the rock, and he said to them, "Hear now, you rebels: shall we bring water for you out of this rock?" And Moses lifted up his hand and struck the rock with his staff twice, and water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their livestock. And the Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not believe in me, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them." These are the waters of Meribah, where the people of Israel quarreled with the Lord, and through them he showed himself holy.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 16:13-19



If you are physically unable to come forward, please let an usher know and the pastor will come to you and give you communion. Those communing should mark this on the attendance card. Introduction
