Gradelink:

Gradelink is our online student information system. You can log in here to view your child's grades, incident reports, and lunch account balance. This is also where teachers communicate with families, and send out their class newsletters. Beginning in the 25-26 school year, lunch payments are also made through Gradelink. Warrior Review:

Every week during the school year, the main office sends out the Warrior Review-- our school's primary newsletter. Information about everything from athletics, to re-enrollment, upcoming events, and important school notices are shared here, along with exclusive looks inside the classroom and our students' achievements. Links to the academic calendar, lunch menu, and spirit wear store are also always posted here.

Move-In Night

Held the Monday evening before school starts (this year, 8/18 at 5:30pm), Move-In Night gives families a chance to connect before the school year, meet their child's teacher, and pick up required books for the year. Order forms for required books are sent out a few weeks before Move-In Night, and payment is collected via TADS so orders are fully ready on Move-In Night.



TADS

TADS is our primary billing site. This is where enrollment and reenrollment is handled, as well as where tuition, extra fees, Extended Care, and Move-In Night orders are billed. Although invoices are billed here, it is also possible to pay these invoices in the office with cash or check, as long as that is done before the automatic withdrawal date.


REMINDERS AND UPDATES

Soda and caffeinated drinks are no longer allowed at school. Sweatpants, leggings, and joggers are not acceptable to wear at school.





Remember to send immunization records to the school office as soon as possible at the start of the year.







Phones, smartwatches, and similar electronic devices are not used in school. They are collected and kept in safe, locked boxes and returned to students at the end of the day. If you need to contact your child during the school day, please contact the main office.

FAQS

How do I log on to Gradelink? 01

You will receive your login credentials on paper from your child's teacher during home visits, and an email copy will be sent to you before the school year starts, and periodically throughout the year.

How does the hot lunch program work? 02

Hot lunch operates on a prepay system. You can check the balance and add funds to your child's account through Gradelink. Accounts that owe \$30 or more will be billed monthly through TADS. We are also part of the National Free and Reduced Lunch program. You can pick up an application in the office if you'd like to apply.

Where can I find the school calendar 03 and events?

Links to the school calendar and a monthly event calendar is always available in the Warrior Review. We do also have a Google Calendar on our website that you can add to your phone or email.

Where can I find info on school rules?

The Parent Handbook, which all parents receive a copy of, contains in depth school rules and practices on everything from dress code to discipline reports. If you have specific questions about a school rule or policy, reach out to Ms Kate Crnkovich

What is Extended Care? 05

Extended Care is our after-school child care program. If a child isn't picked up by 3pm, they automatically go to Extended Care until they are picked up, no later than 5:30pm. In Extended Care, kids get an after school snack and time to play. Extended Care services are \$5/hour per child, and it is billed monthly through TADS.

What is the difference between TADS 06 and Gradelink?


> Gradelink is our student information system-- it holds things like grades, lunch account balances, and school-parent communication. Hot lunch is also paid through this site. TADS holds all other billing info and invoices. TADS is where you apply and enroll for school every year.

The lower grade years are filled with new experiences and growth as our students begin to discover who God has created them to be, and the many gifts and talents He has blessed them with

Students learn of Jesus and His love for them as they participate in daily bible readings, classroom devotions, religion classes, and weekly chapel services. In chapel our lower grade students are paired with upper grade students to foster relationships.

We provide challenging and inquiry based learning experiences. Most recently we have adopted Bridges Math curriculum which encourages critical thinking, and allows our students to share unique strategies and thinking in a supportive and joyful environment.

Our lower grade children are also offered distinctive opportunities to enhance their educational experience including STEM, C-Team volleyball and basketball, choir, multi-age learning opportunities, and a spring musical.

At the heart of all we do is Jesus and His great love for us all!

Lower Grades FAQs

What makes St Paul's curriculum special?

At St Paul's we believe in educating and fostering growth in all aspect of our students. We teach phonics and cursive as part of our curriculum, use the highly ranked Bridges math program, and offer music opportunities for all grades: K-4 have two music classes per week and choir, 3-4 learn to play the recorder, and 4th grade has optional guitar classes. All grades have physical education classes, as well as 2 recesses per day.

We also follow the Friendzy curriculum for faith-based social and emotional growth. Check the Warrior Review for our monthly themes and at-home activites!

Is there before and after school care? Yes! Morning care begins at 7am and is free. Afternoon care is from end of day until 5pm and there is an hourly fee per child. There is no need to register in advance.

How is hot lunch billed? How does my child sign up?

Teacher's check daily to see if a child is hot lunch or cold that day. Lunch is \$4.25/day. Families can also apply for free/reduced cost lunch. Lunch accounts are billed monthly through TADS, if the account owes more than \$30. Parents can also pre-pay their child's account with cash or check in the office.

Upper Grades FAQs

What makes St Paul's curriculum special?

We offer a wide variety of electives, including astronomy, world religions, culinary arts, and more. Students also take STEM, robotics, coding, and typing as part of their class rotation.

We also feature a robust music program, including choir, band, and guitar. We offer the option for kids to take one-on-one piano lessons during the day as well. Most electives are chosen at the end of the year, for the coming year. New families receive elective enrollment information during home visits. Piano lessons are conducted by Carrie Arndorfer, reach out to the office if you are interested.

Our school also follows Friendzy's curriculum for faith based social and emotional growth. Check the Warrior Review for monthly themes and home activities!

What is Camp Luther and the South Dakota trip?

Camp Luther and the South Dakota trips are outdoor education trips that the middle school students take each year. Grades 5-7 spend a week in the spring at Camp Luther on team building activities, service work, and growing in their faith.

8th Grade students go on a trip to South Dakota every fall. This trip offers our students a valuable opportunity to develop their faith, challenge themselves, and bond as a class.

Cost for these trips varies by year, and is billed through TADS. Students may participate in fundraising for South Dakota through their 7th grade year.

The upper grade years are a meaningful time for students to build lasting relationships, grow as leaders, discover their unique talents, and strengthen their relationship with Jesus.

Upper grade students build connections across all grade levels through activities like STEM buddies, reading buddies, and chapel buddies. These interactions help them develop and strengthen their leadership skills. Students are also given opportunities to help their community through the Lord's Cupboard.

Each day, our students engage with God's Word, attend weekly chapel services, and, in grades 7 and 8, attend confirmation classes led by our pastors.

Our students have access to a wide range of sports, music, and extracurricular activities that nurture and develop the gifts and talents God has given them.

Throughout their time in the upper grades we want to equip students to grow academically while preparing them to use their God-given abilities to serve, lead and share Jesus love with those in their communities.
