"Sing, Pray, and Keep His Ways" Synodical Initiative

In September, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod invited congregations to apply to a new synodical initiative called "Sing, Pray, and Keep His Ways." After completing the application, St. Paul's was selected to be part of the first cohort of congregations to participate in the project.

"Sing, Pray, and Keep His Ways" is a five-year project by LCMS Worship Ministry through a grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc. The project is focused on bringing children into active roles in their lives of faith in their congregations, with a particular emphasis on helping children to participate in worship. Congregations involved in the project will be working to develop resources that will eventually be shared with the entire Synod.

In the next step of the project, I will be traveling to St. Louis in early February to meet with other congregational leaders in the first cohort. We will be sharing what we learned about our congregations through the application process, hearing from other Synodical leaders, and working to develop pilot projects to implement in our own congregations.

Over the next few months, keep an eye out for updates about the pilot project that will begin at St. Paul's. Welcome children you see in worship, and form relationships with their families. Continue to model what Christian worship looks like in the pews. Most importantly, pray for the children in our congregation and across the Synod. Ask God that He would keep them in His care, and give our leadership wisdom in helping to incorporate our youngest members into the life of the Church.

Your Place in the Kingdom: Lenten Catechesis on the Table of Duties

"Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him. This is my rule in all the churches." (1 Cor 7:17, ESV)

As many of you know, I have been meditating on the "Table of Duties" in Luther's *Small Catechism* for some time now. Many of you had to memorize the *Small Catechism* for confirmation, but not everyone had to memorize the "Table of Duties." I now see the lack of memorization and meditation on my part as a missed opportunity for me as a man and as a pastor. The "Table of Duties" are "certain passages of Scripture for various holy orders and positions, admonishing them about their duties and responsibilities."

In these last months of meditation on the Table of Duties, the Lord has given me insight about parenting, stewardship of my household and in the congregation, my response to the confusing pandemic situation, the nature of the pastoral office, intergenerational relationships in the workplace, and many more. Meditating on these Biblical texts has been both a call to repentance and an encouragement. This Lent—through these same Biblical passages—I pray that you, too, will begin to gain insight in the mystery of Christ and our life together in Him.

We'll begin on Ash Wednesday (February 18, 2026) and hear a call to repentance and an encouragement regarding our frequently-cited "rights" and the Biblical call to "duties." From there we'll look at the Tables of Duties in the following categories: Churchly Duties, Civic Duties, Family Duties, Economic Duties, and Christian Duties.

Again, I've found my meditations on the Table of Duties challenging, humbling, sometimes revelatory, and always a blessing. Come to the mid-week services in Lent. Ask The Lord to give you "ears to hear."

"And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God." (Philippians 1:9–11, ESV)





February's Hymn of the Month: *God Loves Me Dearly*

(number 392 in *Lutheran Service Book*)



In 1847, German Lutheran pastor August Rische issued a plea for help to establish a "rescue home" for distressed youth. Because of widespread poverty, many children had been essentially abandoned by their parents and had dropped out of school, leaving them reduced to begging and stealing. Rische hoped to use the power of God's Word to teach these young people to become useful members of society. He began composing songs to be sung by children outside of the weekly church service. This hymn is one of those songs.

This hymn is based on the text of 1 John 4:8, "Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love." The simple text proclaims that, although we were in slavery to sin, God sent His only son Jesus to pay the debt we owed. The short refrain emphasizes God's love not just for the world, but "for even me." Singing this after each stanza allows us to meditate on God's personal love for us.

Although this hymn was originally written for children, Christians of every age need to hear the message of this simple hymn over and over. "Therefore I'll say again, God loves me dearly, God loves me dearly, loves even me."


