Congregation at Prayer

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer

The Holy Trinity: *In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit*

May 31 – June 6, 2026

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

From the opening words of Genesis, the Holy Trinity is already acting: the Father speaking, the Spirit hovering, and the Word bringing all things into being. The undivided God works with one will and one power. The same Lord who created all things now stands risen on the mountain in Galilee and declares, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me.”

In Acts 2, Peter proclaims this same divine economy: The Father sending the Son, the Son crucified and raised, and the Spirit poured out to create faith. Not three gods, not three competing works, but one God — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit — accomplishing one salvation. As the Church confesses, the persons are distinct, yet their outward works are indivisible.

Psalm 16 promises a God who stands at our right hand, and Jesus fulfills it: “I am with you always.” The Father creates, the Son redeems, the Spirit sanctifies — and the whole undivided Trinity is present with His people. Not by feeling, not by merit, but by promise.

Christ sends His Church to “make disciples of all nations,” and He Himself supplies the means: Holy Baptism, where the Triune Name is placed upon us and we are made a new creation, and the teaching of His Word, through which the Spirit grants and sustains faith. The Church’s mission is not self-improvement or self-invention, but the delivery of God’s gifts.

Because Jesus lives, we will live. Because He rose, we will rise. Because He reigns, our future is secure. The Holy Trinity — one God in three persons — is the God of creation, redemption, and a new and eternal life.

Order Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Second Sunday after Pentecost (Pastor Schockman)

The promise of God does not rest on human keeping of the Law, which only brings wrath, but on the righteousness of faith credited to the ungodly (Rom. 4:13–15). In calling Matthew the tax collector, Jesus visibly demonstrates this Gospel reality, showing that He *came "not to call the righteous, but sinners"* (Matt. 9:9, 13). As the Great Physician, He heals the spiritually dead with His grace rather than seeking those who believe they are healthy under the Law (Matt. 9:12; Hos. 6:1), *revealing that God "desires steadfast love and not sacrifice"* (Hos. 6:6; Matt. 9:13) apart from external works. Just as Abraham believed against all human hope in the God *"who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist"* (Rom. 4:17), sinners from all nations are justified entirely extra nos (outside of ourselves) by trusting in the One who *"was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification"* (Rom. 4:24–25). Welcomed by sheer mercy to recline at His table, we who have been justified by faith are now freed from the leverage of the Law to extend that same Christ-like forgiveness to our neighbors.

The Holy Trinity

Genesis 1:1-2:4a

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day. And God said, "Let there be an expanse in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." And God made the expanse and separated the waters that were under the expanse from the waters that were above the expanse. And it was so. And God called the expanse Heaven. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day. And God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. And God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind, on the earth." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day. And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth." And it was so. And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day. And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens." So God created the great sea creatures and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day. And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures according to their kinds—livestock and creeping things and beasts of the earth according to their kinds." And it was so. And God made the beasts of the earth according to their kinds and the livestock according to their kinds, and everything that creeps on the ground according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the heavens and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day. Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation. These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

Acts 2:14a, 22–36

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him, "I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption. You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence." Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, "The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool." Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

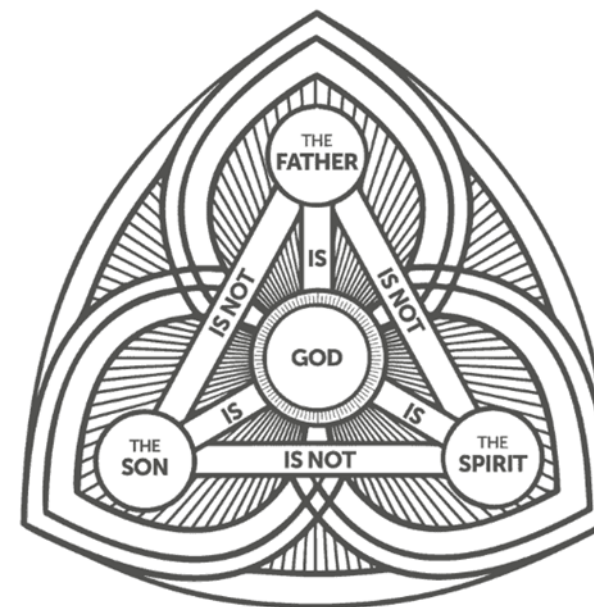

If you hold a confession differing from The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod or are not yet confirmed in our confession of faith, we welcome you to come forward for a blessing (Please indicate by folding your hands over your heart.). If you are physically unable to come forward, please let an usher know and the pastor will come to you and give you communion. Those communing should mark this on the attendance card. If you have questions, our pastors will be pleased to speak with you.

Distribution and Communion Wine

Please place open hands out to receive the Body of Christ and also to indicate whether you are receiving the Blood of Christ from the common cup or the individual cup. The wine glasses in the center of each tray contain **one drop** of communion wine. The glasses that contain more wine are dark in color.
